- **1929** Deiter Bros. is born when three Deiter family members with one truck begin delivering ice, and later coal, to families in Bethlehem, PA.
- **1930s** Improvements in burner and 768771 delivery technologies improve living conditions for Americans during the Great Depression. The liquid heating fuel market continues to grow.
- **1940s** After World War II, many returning veterans find work in the booming heating fuel industry. Deiter Bros. begins providing heating oil along with coal.
- **1947** 88,083 oil burners are sold in the U.S. More Lehigh Valley homes convert from coal to the clean convenience of oil.
- **1973** OPEC oil embargo creates a massive supply shortage. The price of heating oil skyrockets to over 34 cents a gallon, more than double its previous price of 16 cents.
- **1990** Soybean oil-based biodiesel is introduced as a replacement for diesel fuel.
- 2000s To reduce emissions, future-minded providers begin adopting low and ultra-low sulfur heating fuel. Deiter Bros. is the ONLY company in our region to make the move to cleaner heating oil by developing and trademarking **EnviraFuel**® in 2003.
- 2006 Clean Fuels Alliance America, formerly known as the National Biodiesel Board, trademarks Bioheat® to describe the blends of biodiesel and heating fuel.
- 2014 The first statewide Bioheat[®] law goes into effect in Rhode 3661 Island, also requiring a 2% biodiesel blend.
- 2020 Cleaner, greener heating oil improvements continue. Innovations in heating system technology and everimproving fuel blends like Deiter Bros. **EnviraFuel**® produce more heat from less fuel, with far less environmental impact, than at any time in history.

Energy Outlook

U.S. Oil Refiners Ran at Over 90% to Keep Supplies Flowing But Now Must Cut Back for Seasonal Maintenance

During the past year, U.S. oil refiners helped to keep domestic gasoline and diesel supplies flowing, hitting record-breaking utilization rates at refineries throughout the nation. Their performance was a key factor in keeping domestic petroleum-based fuels flowing during a year full of uncertainties in the global markets due to Russia's threats and other socioeconomic impacts. It was the highest output in 5 years.

But after operating at more than 90% capacity for most of 2022, the largest U.S. refiners are now signaling that they may have to cut back. Reuters reported that following record refinery utilization last year, many U.S. refiners expect to have lower capacity in the first quarter of 2023 due to a heavy maintenance season.

Because capacities will dip below 90% to around 85% for refinery maintenance, analysts indicate that this should set the stage for another spike in gasoline 770355 and diesel prices during the summer of 2023.



Gas Stoves Latest Target in "Electrify Everything" Government Agenda

How we cook our meals is the latest burning question in the debate about what's best for 266526 American families. Gas stoves are the current target of the U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC) which has proposed regulations on existing or new gas stoves that could ban their use.

There are multiple takes on the reasons, or lack thereof, for this focus on gas stoves. One study tied 12% of childhood asthma cases to gas stoves. But that study was partly funded by RMI, a nonprofit known for advocating aggressive green policies to "transform global energy systems across the real economy."

On the opposite side of the debate is perhaps the most respected peer-reviewed medical journal in the world— *The Lancet*. According to a statement published in *The Lancet Respiratory Medicine*: "We detected no evidence of an association between either the use of gas as a cooking fuel and either asthma symptoms or asthma diagnosis."

When considering the safety of gas versus electric stoves, perhaps these government watchdogs should consider a 2020 study by the National Fire Protection Association (NFPA) which revealed the following facts:

- Electric ranges caused household fires at a rate 2.6 times greater than gas stoves;
- Electric ranges caused civilian injuries at a rate 4.8 times higher than gas stoves;
- Electric ranges caused civilian deaths at a rate 3.4 times higher than gas stoves.

Days after the CPSC told Bloomberg that "any option is on the table" and calling gas stoves a "hidden hazard," the Biden administration felt the blowback and walked back comments about an outright federal ban on gas stoves. Apparently they couldn't stand the voters' heat so they got out of the kitchen on this issue...at least for now.

HOME SAFETY

Potential Fire Hazards Increasing with Growing Number of Lithium-Ion Batteries

With the exploding popularity of electric bikes and scooters all over our Lehigh Valley, as well as battery-powered household items from laptops to leaf blowers, comes a growing risk of fires caused by lithium-ion batteries.



A recent safety alert issued by the Fire Department of New York (FDNY) emphasizes that improper charging, storage, damaged or unstable batteries can cause the batteries to overheat, leading to an explosive, aggressive fire that spreads rapidly, can reignite and is tough to extinguish.

"Lithium battery fires are very dangerous. Battery cells are known to explode and quickly spread to another battery and devices," states the FDNY warning. "These batteries may continue to generate heat even when there is no visible sign of fire. Reignition of lithium-battery fires is common. They can unexpectedly reignite without warning minutes, hours, even days after a visible fire has been put out."

Lithium-Ion Battery Safety DOS & DON'TS

- **Do** follow manufacturer's charging and storage instructions.
- Do plug directly into a wall outlet when recharging.
- **Do** keep batteries and devices at room temperature.
- **Do** use the correct battery, cord and power adapter.
- **Do** keep away from heat sources.
- Do recycle batteries safely and properly.*
- **Don't** use aftermarket (or generic) batteries or chargers. Check for certification by a Nationally Recognized Testing Laboratory like UL, NSF or CSA.
- **Don't** plug into a power strip or overload an outlet.
- **Don't** overcharge or leave a battery charging overnight.
- **Don't** leave e-bikes or 34257 e-scooters unattended while charging.
- **Don't** place batteries in municipal trash or recycling bins or dumpsters. It is illegal and dangerous.*

*For safe recycling of lithium-ion batteries, contact local Home Depot stores and ask about Call2Recycle sites near you.

SPRING & SUMMER WEATHER FORECAST

APRIL

You might get pranked on Saturday, April 1st, but this month's downpours will be no joke. Temps will only be 2-degrees below the average of 51, but it will feel much cooler with each week awash in steady seasonal rains. Easter weekend (7th to 9th) will be misty but no deluge with celestial sunshine breaking through on Sunday. April showers will continue to soak in from Earth Day on the 22nd. It'll be a moist month but for gardeners, the wetter the better.

MAY

After shaking off a bit of the soggy hangover from April, May's mercury finally elevates to a balmy 65-degrees, 2 above average and the opening days prove welcome, warm and sunny right up until Mother's Day on the 14th. Precipitation is 2-inches above average but much of that will drop after the 22nd. Plan your Memorial Day weekend (27th, 28th, 29th) events under safe and adequate cover, it will be sopping with soaking skies and potential for serious thunderstorms.

JUNE

Here's our pick for "Month Most Likely to Love You Back." With average temps of 71-degrees and precipitation only 1-inch above normal, June promises to be a delightful dance of sunshine and rainbow mists right up to a very warm Father's Day on the 18th. Nature lowers the booms with twin thunderstorms in Week 3 but that's it for the unsettled stuff. With Independence Day on a Tuesday, many families will be rolling the weekend into a 4-day break. Great idea! July 1st to 7th will be All-American excellence. Weatherwise, a few big thunder boomers rock the Valley in Week 2 followed by a stretch of sweatbox swelter that will put a 24/7 strain on any AC system...here's hoping you've had yours tuned up by now. These days kick off The Summer Sizzle of 2023 and while a few raindrops will cool things slightly in Week 4, they're hardly enough to beat this degree of heat.

JULY

AUGUST

The meltdown marathon continues with temps 3-degrees above average and the lowest rainfall of the year. Sparse showers in Week 1 give way to Sahara-like conditions which will curtail many outdoor activities and have many asking: "Is this the Lehigh Valley or Death Valley?" Healthwise, stay hydrated and close to cooling systems at home or work. Plenty of AC systems won't make it through this test of fire so if you have any concerns, call us BEFORE the heat hits! 2183 Anemic rains end the month but they're only drops in a blistering bucket.

SEPTEMBER

Relief comes with a 10-degree drop from August's average temps and Labor Day weekend (2nd to 4th) will be sunny and as comfortable as a well-worn t-shirt. Intense showers drench the Valley midmonth replenishing low water tables, followed by two weeks of consistently sunny days and increasingly cooler nights. The 23rd is the official start of Autumn 2023 which is, for many of us, the most beautiful of the Lehigh Valley's four stunning seasons.

What's next after gas stoves are regulated?

The push to regulate everyday appliances—including water heaters, furnaces and boilers, clothes washers and dryers, dishwashers, microwaves, shower heads, etc.—comes as some lawmakers continue to pursue lofty (many say unachievable with current technologies) net-zero climate goals.

"That's bad news for almost every room in the house," says Ben Lieberman, a senior fellow at the Competitive Enterprise Institute (CEI). "Climate activists and the current administration want 4120 homeowners to stop using natural gas and to electrify everything."

"As heating industry professionals, we know the comparable costs to heat homes. In most cases, electric heating systems cost more than those powered by clean-burning propane, natural gas and heating oil," says Jim Deiter, president of Deiter Bros. Heating Cooling, "Plus, the cost to switch to electric systems can cost consumers 57902 thousands of dollars. For many families, the common sense choice is very clear."

So, what makes the most sense at this point? According to Lieberman: "It makes sense to give consumers a choice rather than force them to electric."
