Coal sales and service are added. Deiter Bros. moves to 1226 Webster Ave., later renamed as Stefko Blvd, and adds fuel oil delivery and service. One of their fleet's workhorses was this 1938 International truck. Uncle Herbie reinforced the standard bed with steel beams fitted to handle heavier loads of ice and coal. It was sold in the 1960s, lost to time, then discovered four decades later in a

garage in Cetronia, PA. Jim Sr. brought it back home to Deiter Bros. and restored it to its original glory, as shown.







Coal is still king for many Lehigh Valley homeowners and Deiter Bros. delivers more than 18,000 tons a year. But the post-war boom years see more homeowners switching to the convenience of oil heat. "Let Deiter's

Fleet Deliver Your Heat" becomes a popular slogan.






1990s

Community Opinions & Insights: Mass. Natural Gas Explosions Could Happen Here Next

On September 13, 2018, natural gas explosions and fires rocked communities in Massachusetts, causing multiple injuries, one death, and countless properties destroyed.

Why? We know that the local gas utility — Columbia Gas — announced early in the day that they would be "upgrading" gas lines in the neighborhood. Around 4 p.m. that day, reports of gas odors, fires and explosions began pouring into 911.

Roads were closed, 8,000+ people were evacuated from their homes, and power was cut to 18,000 homes. Most tragically, a teenage boy was killed in his family's driveway when their house exploded. An *Associated News* report from September 18 titled "Pressure before Mass. gas explosions was 12 times higher than normal" said the tragedy is under investigation by the National Transportation Safety Board but early indicators point to excessive pipeline pressure just before the explosions.

It happened there and it has repeatedly happened here in our Lehigh Valley. Sadly, we need not go too far back in history to remember the five deaths and destruction caused by the Allentown natural gas explosions of February 2011.

Old, degrading natural gas lines snake for countless miles under our neighborhoods, in Allentown, Bethlehem, Easton and many Lehigh Valley municipalities. They are the responsibility of our regional gas utility, UGI. But rather than upgrade all old infrastructure to ensure the future safety 13128 of our communities, the gas provider is in a headlong rush to get new customers by building miles of new pipelines out into the suburbs.

Natural gas utilities should be REQUIRED to upgrade all old gas infrastructure BEFORE building their pipeline system out in an effort to keep adding customers. The dirty and deadly secret is that ratepayers (current gas customers) are paying for the utility to add new customers *at no charge* rather than properly upgrade dangerously decaying pipelines on the "other side of town."

This slapdash approach to older pipelines is in evidence here in Bethlehem, right on Stefko Boulevard in front of Deiter Bros. Crews have been here to repair the gas line over 20 times! Easton Avenue and Butztown Road have the same chronic problems caused by "bandaid" repairs rather than long-term solutions.

Along with the tick-tick of the natural gas time bomb comes the more immediate insult of how they leave our road surfaces after they tear them up repeatedly. Our municipalities should hold them accountable for the conditions of taxpayer roads. At 105991 the very least, make them come back and patch the roads to the point where they can accommodate traffic smoothly, rather than the quick-fix messes of lumpy asphalt they habitually leave behind now.

Don't gas utility shareholders *know* how decayed these older pipeline infrastructures are? Isn't it more responsible to proactively protect the safety and health of tens of thousands of people...rather than wait for the next tragedy to happen? Or is it that they just don't care?

Move Over Saudi Arabia and Russia, U.S. Now the World's #1 Oil Producer

The U.S. is now the world's largest producer of crude oil. In February 2018, the U.S. vaulted ahead of Saudi Arabia for the first time in 20 years, according to the U.S. Energy Information Administration (EIA). By August, U.S. output hit an astounding 11 million barrels per day, surpassing Russia for the first time since 1999.

American oil output has more than doubled during the past decade, due 150483 in large part to the U.S. shale oil boom.

"It's all about technological improvements, supported by ample capital to invest, and the ingenuity of American oil drillers," said Bob McNally, president of Rapidon Energy Group oil industry analysts. "It's a historic milestone and a reminder: never bet against the U.S. oil industry."

Two Factors Could Spike Natural Gas Prices This Winter: Less Storage and More Exports

You won't hear UGI or other natural gas monopolies talking about it, but two factors that could impact the supply/demand balance this winter has energy industry experts watching very closely as the cold weather approaches: less storage and more exports.

According to a July report in *Forbes* magazine: "Natural gas inventories are almost 20% below the five-year average. Storage is crucial to meeting winter needs because we don't produce enough to 111550 meet demand, as gas is used heavily in heating and power generation by the big utilities."

Natural gas exports condensed into easily shipped LNG (Liquid Natural Gas) are also rising rapidly. With more natural gas shipped offshore, domestic supplies and limited storage could drive prices upward for American homeowners. According to a report by the Energy Information Administration, LNG exports *quadrupled* in 2017. "As we continue to export more gas, storage will become increasingly critical to meet cold winter demands in two of the largest importers of American gas — China and Europe."

Will Our State's Elected Officials Vote for This New CASH PIPELINE for Gas Companies?

HB 107 is a new bill going for a vote in the PA State Legislature which would allow natural gas utilities to add a surcharge to customers' bills to help pay for new pipelines to provide gas access to more commercial and residential customers.

According to a recent article in the Scranton Times-Tribune: This legislation is patently unfair to consumers and bad policy for the state. In effect, it calls for a new tax on one group of Pennsylvanians to subsidize an industry that does not need to reach into consumers' pockets to make a profit. Pennsylvania taxpayers should not be expected to pay a new energy tax to help create better returns for shareholders.

The market, not the State Legislature, should drive natural gas expansion...the gas companies (like UGI) do not need a handout from taxpayers. If passed, HB 107 will order (by law!) natural gas customers in regions already piped for gas to pay the bill for 801687 the utilities to put new pipelines into regions currently free of them. In effect, consumers will be paying for a new CASH PIPELINE for the gas monopolies, fattening profits for them and their shareholders.

Here at Deiter Bros., we believe this is flat out wrong and we have contacted our PA State Legislators to VOTE NO on HB 107. If you agree, please join us.

Weather experts seldom agree 100% of the time but rarely do they provide prognostications that are polar opposites. But that is the case with this season's "Tale of Two Almanacs."

According to the *Farmers' Almanac* (founded 1818) their prediction "melts rumors of a mild winter! It's going to be a 'teeth chattering' cold one, with plenty of snow."

Yet the rival *Old Farmer's Almanac* (founded 1792) calls for this winter to be "warmer than normal, with above-normal precipitation and near- to below-normal snowfall."

Hmmmm, whom to believe? Here at Deiter Bros. we're sticking with Old Reliable, for two reasons. First, our family business turns 90 in 2019, so we're no spring chickens ourselves...and with age comes wisdom. (At least that's what Dad keeps telling me!) Second reason: A warmer winter would 760892 mean less wear and tear on our service teams and trucks and lower fuel costs for our customers.

NOVEMBER

Big 3° F. warmer than average and slightly drier all month. Starts with two weeks of flip-flopping cold and light snow flurries then sunny skies and uncharacteristic warmth for the long Thanksgiving (11/22) weekend. Wraps up in final week like many of those T-day leftovers still stashed in the fridge: cold and damp.

DECEMBER

Wetter than average with rain and light snow dusting in Week 1 with the season's first "shovel-worthy" snowfall hitting the Valley around mid-month. You're getting warmer! Actually, 3° F. warmer for the monthly average with only light flurries right up until Valentine's Day on Thurs., 2/14. Rainy days with progressively higher temps tempt us throughout the balance of Love Month, but don't fall for the tease just yet...there's still some winter left.

MARCH

Living up to its billing, March will roar in like a lion with frigid temps, blustery winds and more sustained downpours than usual throughout the first two weeks. But the luck of the Irish will break the soaking spell for St. Patrick's Day (Sun. 3/17) weekend. And the first day of Spring is on the 20th, so hang in there. Our last sloppy snowfall of the season hits around the 25th but vanishes quickly with fresh leaf buds and well-watered flowers blooming across the beautiful Lehigh Valley.
