• • • WEATHER FORECASTS • • •

Deiter Bros. may have been around since 1929 but we're babies compared to the Old Farmer's Almanac, published every year since 1762. According to this venerable source, we're in for some colder and snowier weather in January, 2006 with generally below-average temperatures and more rain toward mid-year. Here's a look at what the Almanac's prognosticators predict weatherwise for our Lehigh Valley area:

January

Bundle up for average monthly temperature of 26 degrees (7 degrees below average). It will be sunny and seasonable from New Year's to

midmonth, with 014581 light snow. Then we'll get slammed with heavy snow and bitter cold until the 20th. Very cold temps stay until the 26th when heavy snows return to finish out the month.

February

The Love Month lives up to its rep. Average temps climb to 40 degrees (7 degrees above average). Seasonable temps and some snow come early then mild weather with trade-offs between rainy and sunny days round out the month.

March

Temperatures are 1 degree below the average of 42 with precipitation 1" above. February's warmth turns cold in early March with rain and snow, continuing with 308158 chilly weather and lots of rain. Look for a sunny and mild break from the 19th to 24th, then back to chilly and rainy toward month's end.

April

The mercury stays 2 degrees below the average of 50 with precipitation 1.5" above the average. April Fool's to mid-month is sunny and cool with intermittent rain, turning very warm with thunderstorms until the 21st. The month ends with April showers, sunny days and cooler temps.



May

Temperatures are a half-degree below the 61.5 average with rain 1" above

average. Showers and warm temps begin the month then break from the 11th to 18th with sunnier, cooler May Days. Warmer temps with scattered thunderstorms into Memorial Day.

June

Nice weather with temperatures averaging 70.5 degrees and rain below average. Sunny and warm days with cool nights with just a smattering of thunderstorms to dampen the last week of a lovely month.

PROGRAM YOUR THERMOSTAT: Programmable thermostats are easy to install and operate, and they save money by turning down the heat when you need it least. You can set it to keep you 403552 comfortably warm during your waking hours at home AND save money by automatically lowering the setting when you're asleep, at work or away from home.

FLUORESCENT BULBS SAVE MONEY: You know how incandescent bulbs get hot while fluorescents do not? That heat is energy being wasted and you're paying for it. Fact is, fluorescent bulbs save 75% more energy than incandescents. Figure how many lights you have in your home and you can see how that can add up.

LET THE SUN DO ITS JOB: Open blinds and curtains on sunny days. You'll be surprised how effective the passive solar heat can be in warming your home and cutting back on fuel use.

WHAT IS YOUR HOT WATER COSTING YOU? Few homeowners know it, but heating domestic water can comprise 30% of your home's energy bill, depending on your family size and habits. You can save by setting your hot water heater to a lower temperature. Install water-flow restrictors to lower your water bill and the energy costs to heat it. Or, if your hot water heater is more than 10 years old, consider replacing it with a newer, more energy-efficient model.

Remember: the OVERALL life expectancy of an electric hot water heater is 14 years...gas water heaters are even shorter at 12 years. Years of hard use coat heating surfaces with energy-robbing mineral scale, cutting down exchange efficiency. Plus, the units made over a decade ago are nowhere near as efficient as today's technology. It's Home Humidifier Season: **IS YOURS READY?**

The dry months of our Lehigh Valley winters can dry out more than skin. Low humidity can also crack walls, wooden furniture and make our throats more vulnerable to bacteria. The smart way to fight these 404367 conditions is with a home humidifier. We've installed quite a few home humidifiers in our day and here are a few tips we share with homeowners to ensure that these comfortmakers perform well throughout the winter:

- Make sure the saddle valve is fully open.
- Make sure the bypass damper is open during the winter and closed during the summer.
- Make sure the drain is free of clogs.
- Make sure water runs freely and the water line is open.
- Change the evaporative element every year.
- And lastly, if your unit has a power cord... make sure it is plugged in.

New Federal Air Conditioning Ratings Go Into Effect January 23, 2006

An important change mandated by the Federal government goes into effect early 2006 and as a Deiter Bros. customer, we want to keep you informed. It centers around the efficiency of central air conditioning units as determined by the Seasonal Energy Efficiency Rating, or **SEER**. Today's standard air conditioning unit has a minimum SEER rating of 10. After January 23, 2006, the minimum standard that can be manufactured is 13 SEER.

The good news is that 13 SEER uses 25% less energy than the current 10 standard. Unfortunately, this energy efficiency comes with a considerably higher price tag. And the units we have been installing in recent years are already in the 10 to 12 SEER efficiency range...which is still very good. So what 305790 happens to customers who have had new central air systems installed in recent years? Here's an overview:

- As stated, most recent installations have been 10 and 12 SEER systems. All are well-engineered systems that have many years of energy-efficient service ahead of them. Our view is that "if it ain't broke, don't fix it." We have been assured by manufacturers that parts will be available for the life of these systems. And you can always count on Deiter Bros. to repair them right.
- 13 SEER units are larger than previous units. This may be a concern if your present air conditioner is snugly fitted into a special portal or other inlet in your home or business. Because the exterior dimensions of the 13 SEER units are larger, additional carpentry may be required when it comes time to upgrade your central air conditioning.

Carbon Monoxide Poisoning: A VERY REAL DANGER

When we button up our homes for winter by sealing for draft leaks and other conservation moves, we may also be sealing in the silent killer: carbon monoxide. Because of higher fuel prices, some homeowners turn to 207085 alternative heating sources to cut bills. But they may not be aware of the higher levels of carbon monoxide these may generate. Here are some life-saving guidelines to help prevent a carbon monoxide tragedy.

KNOW THE SYMPTOMS: Carbon monoxide is known as the silent killer because it is colorless, odorless and kills without warning. Symptoms of CO poisoning include:

- Headaches
- Weakness
- Dizziness
- Disorientation
- Unusually red cheeks (CO replaces oxygen in your blood...flushed cheeks are a sign of this.)

INSPECT FOR SOURCES OF CO: Carefully inspect your home or workplace for common CO sources. Any appliance or device burning a fuel or any internal combustion engine could be a source.

CAREFULLY CHECK ALL...

- Furnaces
- Fireplaces
- Space heaters (other than electric)
- Gas-fired appliances, including stoves or grills
- Hot water heaters
- Chimneys and flues to make certain they are clear of bird nests or other blockages

NEVER, NEVER, NEVER:

- NEVER use your kitchen stove as a heater... even in emergencies
- NEVER grill indoors with charcoal or propane
- NEVER run an internal combustion engine inside a closed area without venting the exhaust outside.

INSTALL CARBON MONOXIDE DETECTORS NOW: Buy only detector units that are warranted and UL approved. The costs range from \$20 to \$70...money well spent. Don't forget to install them in the garage and workshop as well as your home.



Safeguarding Your Privacy: Protect Yourself from Identity Theft

It used to be that we had to worry about protecting our possessions from thieves. But the technology explosion has created a new type of thief that starts by stealing information ... and then your material wealth, possessions and peace-of-mind. These criminals rob identities.

Identity thieves start by stealing vital data about you, such as your Social Security number, credit card account number, or the number on those blank "balance transfer" checks the credit card companies bombard us with. According to Laura Mazzarella, an attorney with the Federal Trade Commission, identity theft was the #1 consumer complaint to the FTC last year. Her advice: "Take steps now to protect your privacy and limit the amount of information you give out. Also, take advantage of every opportunity to limit what companies can share about you.

To help our customers protect their identities, the experts at Deiter Bros.' Four Seasons Security Division, offers these important steps:

1) SHRED SENSITIVE DOCUMENTS

Identity thieves rummage through trash cans looking for credit card statements and other financial information. In the wrong hands, these waste papers can cost you dearly...yet a shredder can cost as little as \$25.

2) BEWARE OF ONLINE SCAM ARTISTS

Never reply to any e-mail asking you to verify personal data such as your Social Security number or passwords. These may

look official but are phony setups looking to get into your wallet. If you're concerned about an account, call the business directly and ask them to verify the e-mail request.

(3) SHOP ONLY ON SECURE WEBSITES

If you shop online, always make sure that the page where you input credit card info says "https" in the URL address. That "s" stands for secure. It verifies that the website is using encoded safety precautions to prevent data interception.

4) CHECK YOUR CREDIT REPORT REGULARLY

Federal law now allows you a free copy of your credit report each year from three major credit reporting agencies. It's an excellent way to catch unauthorized purchases, changes to personal information or fraudulent accounts. Visit

5) KEEP YOUR SOCIAL SECURITY NUMBER A SECRET

Okay, some situations warrant sharing it. But others do not. Do not issue this number 001920 freely or within earshot of others, say, in a bank teller line. It's not necessary. Also, avoid carrying your card in your wallet. If the wallet is stolen, so is your identity. Social security numbers can be used to open up fraudulent accounts.

6) SCRUTINIZE WARRANTY CARDS

In many cases, you may not need to send in the warranty card to be eliqible for coverage. Call the manufacturer to find out and keep receipts as proof of purchase. The info you issue on written cards is the data you don't want "out there."

THE BOTTOM LINE: "Anytime you exchange information with a business, you should treat your data like money," says Robert

> Gelman, a Washington, DC-based privacy consultant.

If you do give up data, you'd better be receiving something of value in return.
