Gas Heat Prices Rising FAST

Heating Oil Prices Projected to "Remain Relatively Low," According to U.S. Energy Information Administration

Mom always told me nobody likes an "I told you so." So I won't get on my soapbox about natural gas prices now going up. (I'll let the news reports in this issue speak for themselves.) But it wasn't that long ago that the natural gas utilities had consumers whipped into a "herd mentality" about it being the cheapest way to heat homes. They spent millions advertising that myth and, unfortunately, plenty of families fell for 761549 it. What those utilities omitted from their "gas line" sales pitch was the cost to switch...costs that may never be recovered now that gas prices are on the rise.

According to the American Energy Coalition (AEC): "It would cost between \$4,500 and \$10,000 to convert from oil to gas. With today's natural gas prices, it could take you more than 45 years to recoup the cost to convert your heating system! As gas prices keep rising, a payback may be impossible."

Oh, but natural gas is supposedly better for the environment...or so claimed the gas utilities. Really? Turns out that's another untruth. According to a recent report to Congress by the National Oilheat Research Alliance (NORA), the

new BioFuel heating oil formulations like Deiter Bros.' own EnviraFuel brand—"produce lower emissions than natural gas over 20 years."

That report also notes that natural gas is 95 percent methane, a gas 28-84 times more damaging to the environment than CO2. Fall and Winter: 2016-17 WEATHER FORECAST

With an 80 percent accuracy rate claim for weather predictions,

the <u>Old Farmer's Almanac</u> is our preferred prognostication resource here at Deiter Bros. Plus, they've been doing it for 225 years (since 1792) and this is "only" our 87th year in business (since 1929), so who are we to argue?

OCTOBER

Don't get spooked yet but it looks like this bewitching month will be a lot warmer and wetter than usual. Average temps will be 6 degrees hotter and rainfall 4½ inches soggier with most of this heat/rain combo 800756 coming in the first three weeks. (This pattern is rare...should make for an interesting fall foliage season.) Clear skies and cool nights return for neighborhood trick-or-treaters during the last weekend of the month.

NOVEMBER

Does colder-than-normal weather during elections have any bearing on our nation's future? Hope not. The month will be 3-degrees chillier on average but with clear skies called for on Tuesday, November 8, weather will not be an excuse for voters to stay away from the polls! The season's first snow/rain mix falls around the 20th with the winter's first big chills extending through the long Thanksqiving weekend.

DECEMBER

Deck the halls with boughs of...palm trees?
Well, not quite, but this holiday month's forecast
will be unseasonably warmer with the mercury a full 6-degrees
above average! Look for Weeks 1 and 2 to be both sunny and
mild. As we get closer to the 22nd, it will be grow wetter yet
stay unusually warm with only a very slim chance for a fast
pressure shift from the North and a Cool Yule. (Just don't bet

the sleigh on a white Christmas this year.) Rain and icy nights for week leading up to New Year's Eve.

JANUARY

Gee, we hope all of 2017 isn't this boring! The month kicks off way more mild than wild with warmth up by 3-degrees average and no big surprises for first 10 days until a steep drop into subzeroville breaks in for a brief period. Then intermittent showers and mild temps carry through the rest of this month's forecast with only an occasional snow flurry to bust up the monotony. Good for heating bills, lousy for skiers. Compared to most January weather patterns, this year's is strictly ho-hum.

FEBRUARY

Talk about a cold, cold heart! February starts out the first two weeks all lovey-dovey with average temps and only a bit more precipitation than usual. Then around Valentine's Day we get "dumped" big-time with our first serious snowfall. Fickle February makes up for that cold shoulder 3570 with sunny days and only occasional "wintry mix" precipitation throughout the final two weeks of our icy relationship.

MARCH

Sun? What sun? 2-degrees colder than average with the opening two weeks dominated by sullen gray days, ice water showers and slushy snows. The good news is St. Patrick's Day (the 17th) is on a Friday with blue skies beaming back on the weekend of the 18th for the local parades and pub crawls. Winter marches out with more cold showers and a final wet kiss of snow at month's end. *Welcome Spring!*

PROPANE: Energy Game-Changer Was Invented in the Lehigh Valley!

Here's one to stump the trivia buffs. Propane—that cleanest of fossil fuels now preferred by over 60 million Americans—was invented right here in the Lehigh Valley! In 1912, Allentown chemist Walter O. Snelling first distilled the gas from gasoline and compressed it into a transportable liquid form. According to an article in the New York Times from March 31, 1912, Snelling "has developed a liquid gas and a steel bottle which will carry enough to light an ordinary house for three weeks to a month."

Now the history of Snelling's game-changing energy source is showcased in an exhibit at the National Museum of Industrial History, which opened in August in a former Bethlehem Steel facility on the city's south side at 602 East 2nd Street. The exhibit tracks propane's history through its evolution, including production processes and the many uses it enjoys today as one of the world's fastest-growing, sustainable and most transportable fuels.

Because hot air balloons are powered by it, the exhibit even 15110 features a virtual ride with visitors stepping into the basket for a propane-powered trip up, up and away.

UGI Customers' Bills Jump 10%...Could be Up to 16% by December 2016 According to a Sept. 1, 2016 report in *The Morning Call*, UGI residential customers will see their monthly bills jump at least 10%...with another rate hike to follow, just in time for the brunt of the heating season. A

large portion of it is in the "customer charge," a flat fee that covers expenses such 764906 as billing and meter reading.

UGI has also filed for another hike of 6% for residential customers beginning Dec. 1, 2016. UGI actually wanted a lot more. According to the report: "The overall base rate increase

is less than half of the \$58.6 million UGI sought when it filed for the rate hike in January."

This is just the beginning of big increases. Among the factors driving the price rise are increased exports 2596 to Europe and Asia. Another major driver are costs to rebuild the aging natural gas delivery system. According to The Morning Call report: "The base rate increase was filed partly as a result of the company's accelerated cast-iron and bare-steel pipeline replacement efforts following the deadly 2011 gas explosion that killed five people in Allentown."
