SPRING & SUMMER WEATHER FORECAST

Given the crazy ups-and-downs that the world has been throwing at all of us this year, getting back to "average" might be a welcome change. Our friends at the *Old Farmer's Almanac* (founded 1792) are calling for very average temperatures and rainfall for our Lehigh Valley region this Spring, Summer and early Autumn. No searing temperatures. No earth-shattering hurricanes. No flying monkeys working for some weird green lady in a pointy black hat. Just good, old average weather...not way hot, not crazy cold, just somewhere in that comfortable zone in between. And that's okay with us here at Deiter Bros. We don't like "average" when it comes to our job performance, but when it comes to the weather we face every day in our work to keep customers comfortable, we'll take it.

According to the weather wizards at the Almanac, their weather predictions are based on magnetic solar storms (sunspot activity), climatology and meteorology. We're betting there's a guy in the backroom with weather-sensing bunions, too, but that's just a hunch. According to the Old Farmer's folks: "Our forecasts emphasize temperature and precipitation deviations from averages. These are based on 30-year statistical averages prepared by governmental meteorological agencies and updated every 10 years." When they roll it all together in prognosticating weather for the past 230 years, they boast an accuracy rate of 80%. I don't know 34695 how you did in school, but for the tough subjects, 80% was about average for me. And sometimes, average is an okay way to be.

MAY

Slightly warmer and wetter than usual but not enough to dampen any gardening or other favorite outdoor activities. The sun shines strong right through to mid-month. Scattered showers and cooler temps are on the menu up to Memorial Day weekend (5/28, 29, 30) which will be a bit wet but nowhere near a washout. When planning your family events, have an "under cover" option ready just in case.

JUNE

This gets our vote for Prettiest Month of 2022. With average temps of 72-degrees and tons of sustained sun, we're rockin' a June tune for at least 75% of the month. Okay, Week 1 is semi-soggy but throughout Weeks 2 and 3 it will be picture perfect, especially for Father's Day (6/19) and the whole week after. Maybe all the attention on Dad gets Mother Nature jealous 113994, because Week 4 cools the party off very quickly with heavy thunderstorms and chilly nights.

JULY

Yes, this will go down as the hottest month of 2022, but at just 2-degrees higher than average it's hardly a sizzler. Or a soaker for that matter, with rainfall at average levels. The long Independence Day weekend (July 4th falls on a Monday this year) will be mostly hot and dry followed by a few sprinkles but nothing to postpone community fireworks displays. Weeks 2 and 3 will be the warmest weeks of the year with zero rain to cool things off so make sure your air conditioner is ready to take the sustained workout. Heavy thunderstorms will rattle through our region in the final week of July.

AUGUST

Get ready for s summer seesaw ride! No, it's not about the temperature, which will be on average 2-degrees warmer throughout August. It's not about the precipitation, which at 4-inches is perfectly average for this month in our region. It's about the timing. Week 1 is rain, rain and more rain. Weeks 2 and 3 are all sunshine days and magically warm nights. But Week 4 whipsaws back to an on-again off-again pattern of gloomy days laden with rain and bright blue skies with average daytime temps in the 80s and sleep-friendly nights. Hmm...seems like somebody has to make up their mind!

SEPTEMBER

Labor Day weekend (9/3, 4, 5) will be moist but manageable for planned outdoor events, just keep an umbrella handy for any outdoor activities because intermittent showers are in the cards. Unlike most previous years, this will not be a slow dance into the Autumn season. Almost like some uncanny clockwork, on the 22nd of September—the first day of Fall—sunny days turn cloudier and cooler and the temperature starts to step down noticeably week by week. Scattered thunderstorms cool the earth throughout mid-month and by Week 4 the crisp smell of Autumn is in the air!

OCTOBER

At 57-degrees average temp, October will be on track for a brilliant leaf-peeping season if the heavier rains predicted—3 inches more than average—fall with more fluff than force. Steady downpours open the month and don't let up until a brief window of glorious Indian Summer weather graces us from the 14th to 18th, then abruptly shuts with a mix of thunderstorm nights and the occasional sunny, cool day. Perfect for watching the local leaves dress in all their flaming color before bidding a glorious goodbye. Halloween (10/31) is on a Monday so many communities will have trick-or-treaters out on Friday and Saturday, both of which are predicted to be rainy so watch out for their safety.

Act Now to Avoid 1.5% Fee by Switching Your Payment Method from Credit Card to Electronic Check Payment

As of July 1, 2022, Deiter Bros. will be instituting a new 1.5% convenience fee on all credit card payments. Like many merchants today, we must adopt this policy because credit card companies are charging exorbitant "swipe fees" which businesses like Deiter Bros. with modest operating margins can no longer afford.

Credit card companies offer users incentives like travel miles and cash-back deals. But who pays for those rewards? The financial reality is that those extras are subsidized by the costs credit card companies charge merchants like Deiter Bros. And those costs have reached the breaking point for small businesses with increasingly slimmer operating margins. Consider these facts:

- Credit card company swipe fees have doubled over the past decade despite technological advances that have driven down their processing costs.

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Here Are Our Experts TOP 5 WAYS to Cut Energy Costs This Summer

1. Higher the Thermostat...Lower the Cost

Yep, it may seem obvious but this is clearly the most effective way to keep energy costs low during the hot months. Setting your indoor temp at 75-degrees is quite comfortable for most families during summer's heat, and it will save you big bucks on electric bills. When you leave the house, turn it up to 78-degrees. Remember: For every degree above 78, you can save about 8% on your AC electric costs!

2. Clean or Replace Your HVAC Air Filters

Dirty air filters overwork your cooling system, and that's hard on your HVAC equipment and your energy bills. If you have washable filters, hose them down with appropriate pressure. (Pay attention to the frame arrows indicating which direction the water stream must flow!) 264110 If you have replaceable filters, put in fresh ones. Wash or change air filters every 3 months...your energy bills will be lower and your HVAC system will last longer.

3. Ceiling Fans? Remember the SUMMER/WINTER Rule

During summer, set your ceiling fans to rotate counterclockwise to push air DOWN. During winter, set them clockwise to push air UP.

4. Pull the Curtains on Summer Heat

Close your curtains and blinds from 11 a.m. to 5 p.m. Especially those on the sunnier south-facing side of your home. U.S. Department of Energy (DOE) studies show medium-colored curtains with white plastic backing can reduce home heat gain by 33%.

5. Your Microwave is a Double-Duty Energy Saver

Ovens and stoves can heat kitchens up by 10 degrees. If electric-powered, they also use a LOT of energy. Both factors will make your electric meter spin like a Frisbee. Simple Summer Solution: microwave more meals. Microwave ovens throw off almost zero heat and use 70% less energy than an electric oven.



It was a hot time on the tarmac when Fire Chief John Demyan of the Lehigh Northampton Airport Authority hosted firefighters from multiple community fire departments in a multi-day training session for aviation fire emergencies. The emergency scenarios on May 2 and 3 were staged but the fires were very, very real.

Searing fields of flame, some leaping more than 20-ft., engulfed simulated sites on the tarmac, inside a jet engine and even within the model for the passenger area of a commercial aircraft. Firemen from multiple companies throughout the Lehigh Valley and beyond fought their way through the conflagrations guided by Chief Demyan and two specialists from Fire Force, Inc. of Columbus, Ohio—lead trainer Steve Roth and president Gene Shepherd.

Deiter Bros. was there to support Lehigh Valley International Airport (ABE) and all the fire departments by providing the propane that fueled the simulated fire conditions for 68975 this FAA-sanctioned training. "It's specialized preparation at this advanced level that serves to keep all of us safer in our travels, homes and workplaces" said Deiter Bros. president Jim Deiter, a former volunteer firefighter. "We're proud to do our part to support all first responders in their missions and salute their dedication to protecting our families and communities."


Here's What Some of the Experts Are Saying

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


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"Great Resignation" Remorse?
